## INVESTMENT OBJECTIVE

The **Anchor BCI Core Income Fund** aims to preserve capital whilst providing income returns.

## INVESTMENT PHILOSOPHY

The Anchor BCI Core Income Fund aims to preserve capital, whilst providing income returns higher than those offered by traditional money market portfolios. Investments to be acquired for the portfolio may include assets in liquid form, money market instruments, bonds, fixed deposits, floating-rate instruments, and other interest-earning instruments. The portfolio may also invest in participatory interests and other forms of participation in portfolios of collective investment schemes, registered in South Africa as well as other similar schemes operated in territories with a regulatory environment which is to the satisfaction of the manager and trustee, and of a sufficient standard to provide investor protection at least equivalent to that in South Africa and which is consistent with the portfolio's primary objective. The portfolio may from time to time invest in listed and unlisted financial instruments, in order to achieve the portfolio's investment objective.




## FUND PERFORMANCE SINCE INCEPTION

Growth of R100 investment (cumulative).



**FUND MANAGER COMMENTARY AT 31 JAN 2026**

The US is experiencing healthy, productivity-driven growth. A supply-side expansion (a positive supply shock), alongside a softening labour market, should drag inflation lower. We see upside risks to the US unemployment rate and downside risks to inflation in 2026. As a result, the US Federal Reserve (Fed) could cut interest rates more than is currently discounted, leading to lower US bond yields and a softer US dollar. Geopolitical risk remains elevated, and the attractiveness of US assets is again being questioned. However, we do not believe the US is on the verge of the broad-based selling typically seen in emerging markets (EMs). Healthy corporate earnings growth should continue to support US equities, while falling inflation and rising unemployment should limit the risk of a spike in bond yields. Aside from economic resilience, a major capital flight from US assets remains unlikely given the size and depth of US financial markets and the persistence of excess savings (current account surpluses) outside the US. While global investors may find it difficult to reduce their exposure to US bonds and equities materially, we expect elevated US dollar hedging activity and continued central bank diversification to persist through 2026, posing downside risks to the greenback. The emerging commodity cycle should be supportive for South Africa's (SA) growth outlook and asset prices. Leading growth indicators are improving, energy and supply-chain constraints have eased, credit extension is accelerating, and both fiscal and external balances are strengthening. Overall, the macroeconomic environment is constructive for SA assets. To take advantage of the high policy-rate environment, over 90% of the portfolio is allocated to floating-rate notes. The Fund has an average life of 3.5 years and a weighted average credit spread of 1.6%. The primary objective remains capital preservation while delivering income returns above those of traditional money market portfolios.
