



Investment Objective

The Fairtree Equity Prescient Fund is an actively managed domestic general equity fund with a focus on maximizing total returns for the client. The Fund's objective is to offer medium to long-term capital growth. The Fund aims to actively invest in equities with a level of capital appreciation and income potential and to outperform its benchmark, the FTSE/JSE Capped Shareholder Weighted All Share Total Return Index (CAPPED SWIX) over the long term.

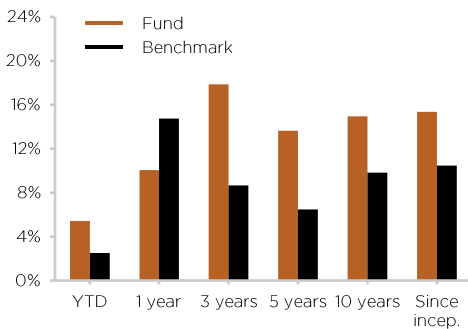
Investment Policy

The portfolio has a long-term focus and invests in securities across all sectors of the JSE Securities Exchange which trade below intrinsic value or have capital appreciation potential. The portfolio may invest in offshore securities when the benefit of higher returns and portfolio diversification are available. Up to 45% of the fund may be invested in foreign securities.

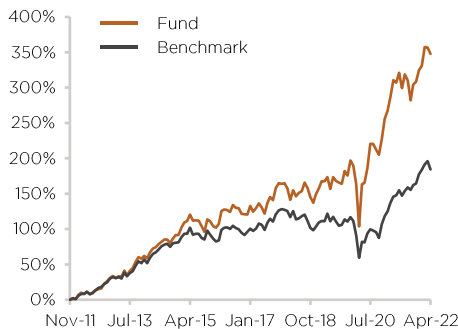
RISK INDICATOR

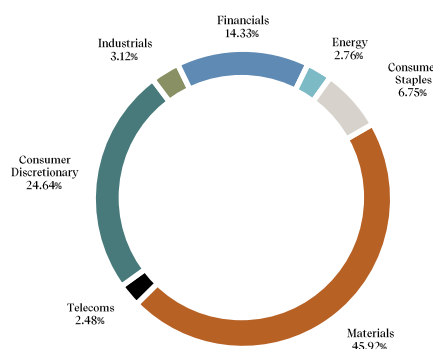

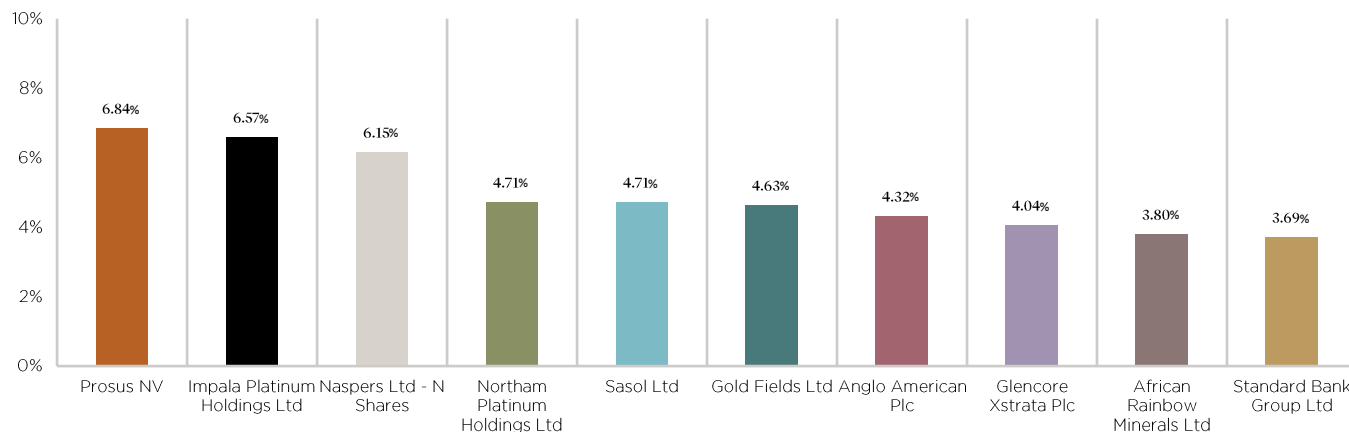

MARKET COMMENTARY

The FTSE/JSE All Share Index (ALSI) decreased by 3.7% during April 2022. FTSE/JSE Shareholder Weighted Index (SWIX) decreased by 4.0% and FTSE/JSE Capped Shareholder Weighted Index (Capped SWIX) decreased by 4.0%. The Rand weakened by 8.1% during the month. Resources, Industrials and Financials decreased by 5.5%, 1.7% and 5.5% respectively.

During April, Bonds decreased by 1.7% and Cash returned 0.4%. The MSCI Emerging Market Index decreased by 5.6% (USD), outperforming the MSCI World Index which decreased 8.3% (USD). The MSCI South Africa index decreased by 12.8% (USD).

Through April, Iron Ore fines decreased 8.5% to \$130.4/t and Thermal Coal decreased by 0.8% to \$258.7/t. Brent Crude oil increased by 4.3%, ending the month on \$107.1/bbl. Gold was down 2.1% to \$1896.9/oz and Platinum decreased by 4.8% to \$939.3/oz. Palladium increased by 2.6% to \$2326.9/oz.

We have tempered our global growth outlook for the year as the developed world continues to tighten financial conditions from the previous ultra-loose policy environment, creating concern for potential policy missteps. The war in Ukraine keeps market fear and uncertainty buoyant and China's insistence on a zero-Covid policy has wreaked havoc in the commodities sector and Chinese equities. We have bought into the market weakness, specifically in resources and by adding to our general mining exposure. The weakness in general mining has stemmed from poor quarterly production updates, followed by China's self-imposed lockdowns causing growth concerns and iron ore weakness. We are of the view that the fall in mining equities is overdone and thus have added to the position by funding from our energy exposure which has performed well year to date given the rise in global energy prices.

We are cautious of the near term impact the war in the Ukraine could have on the rest of Europe, which is one of China's key trade partners. With inflation rising quickly, European demand for goods from China may weaken given the sudden and sharp rise in food and energy costs for European consumers. We are of the view that upside pressure on oil prices will persist while gold will continue to benefit from its role as a safe haven asset and hedge against inflation, which continues to surprise on the upside across all developed markets. The PGM basket has softened due to supply disruption expectations from the war in Ukraine being overdone. This in tandem with the market expecting softer vehicle demand across the Eurozone and China created a headwind for the PGM sector most notably in the last month which has been a detractor to our performance.

The VIX Index (Volatility or 'Fear' Index) increased 33.4% during the month.

The fund's performance was positively impacted by positions in Thungela (47.9%), Sasol (10.6%), British American Tobacco (7.7%) and Glencore (4.7%), while Northam (-13.4%), MTN (-11.2%), Kumba (-18.5%) and Impala (-8.36%) detracted from performance.

The fund invests in a number of focussed strategies. Amongst these strategies we are overweight Cyclical (Diversified Mining, Platinum), Defensive (Gold Mining) and Value (Local Consumer Discretionary, Financials, Industrials).



Glossary

Annualised Performance: Annualised performance shows longer term performance rescaled to a 1 year period. Annualised performance is the average return per year over the period. Actual annual figures are available to the investor on request.

Highest & Lowest Performance: The highest and lowest performance for any 1 year over the period since inception have been shown.

NAV: The net asset value represents the assets of a Fund less its liabilities.

Current Yield: Annual income (interest or dividends) divided by the current price of the security.

Alpha: Denotes the outperformance of the fund over the benchmark.

Sharpe Ratio: The Sharpe ratio is used to indicate the excess return the portfolio delivers over the risk free rate per unit of risk adopted by the fund.

Standard Deviation: The deviation of the return stream relative to its own average.

Max Drawdown: The maximum peak to trough loss suffered by the Fund since inception.

Max Gain: Largest increase in any single month.

% Positive Month: The percentage of months since inception where the Fund has delivered positive return.

High Water Mark: The highest level of performance achieved over a specified period.

Total Expense Ratio (TER%): The Total Expense Ratio (TER) is the percentage of the net asset value of the class of the Financial Product incurred as expenses relating to the administration of the Financial Product.

Performance fee incl. in TER (%) PF (%): The Performance Fee is a payment made to the Fund Manager for generating positive returns and is generally calculated as percentage of investment profits, often both realized and unrealized.

Transaction Costs (TIC%): The Transaction Costs (TC) is the percentage of the net asset value of the Financial Product incurred as costs relating to the buying and selling of the assets underlying the Financial Product.

Total Investment Charges TIC (%) = TER (%) + TC (%): The Total Investment Charges (TIC), the TER + the TC, is the percentage of the net asset value of the class of the Financial Product incurred as costs relating to the investment of the Financial Product. It should be noted that a TIC is the sum of two calculated ratios (TER+TC).

Specific Risk

Default Risk: The risk that the issuers of fixed income instruments may not be able to meet interest payments nor repay the money they have borrowed. The issuers credit quality is vital. The worse the credit quality, the greater the risk of default and therefore investment loss.

The portfolio has adhered to its object and there were no material changes to the composition of the Fund portfolio during the quarter.

Risk Indicator Definition

The Portfolio is more diversified than the benchmark, thus holding smaller positions in the largest capitalisation stocks than the benchmark. This comes with the risk of more volatile relative returns to the broader market when the largest stocks in the benchmark outperform. We believe however that this strategy of holding a more diversified portfolio results in lower single stock risk, and whilst there may be periods of underperformance when the large cap stocks rally, we firmly believe in efficient risk management on an absolute basis. The strategy is also exposed to various factors driving investment performance, for example Value and Momentum, and these factors may also experience periods of relative underperformance. Global research has shown however, that consistent long term exposure to these factors lead to investment reward. This portfolio is permitted to invest in foreign securities which may have additional risks (FX Movements for example). However, the portfolio does not currently hold any foreign securities and the manager does not intend on exposing the portfolio to any foreign securities going forward.
