

Investment Strategy Description:

Emperor is a data-driven, algorithmic asset manager. Our goal is to be South Africa’s best asset manager at a reasonable cost, we aim to achieve this in two ways: Firstly, we simplify the investment process by offering our clients a customised building-block model that can be tailored according to specific risk-and-return objectives. Secondly, we reduce expenses through a combination of low-cost index-tracking ETFs and a proprietary active asset management process that is driven by algorithmic analysis of the market.

Central to the Emperor investment philosophy are what we call our building blocks. These are distinct strategies targeted to Value, Quality, Stability, and Momentum.

This comprises companies we have identified that exhibit lower volatility. Such companies, all around the world, tend to outperform the broader market at a lower risk. Emperor’s Stability building block portfolio invests in companies whose volatility (or riskiness) is measured over periods of both one and three years.

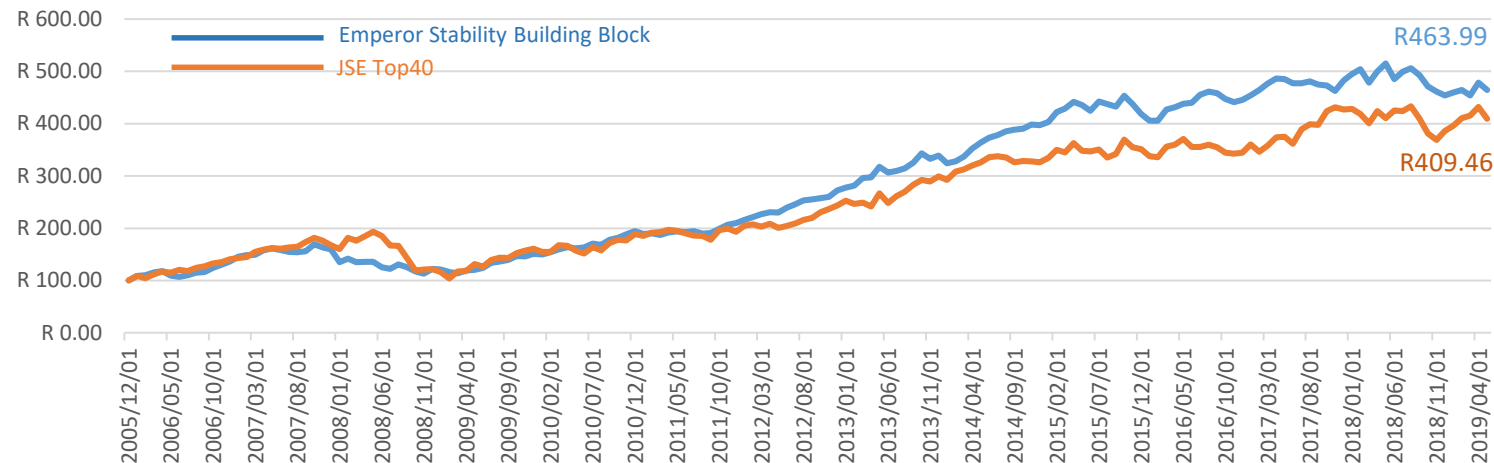

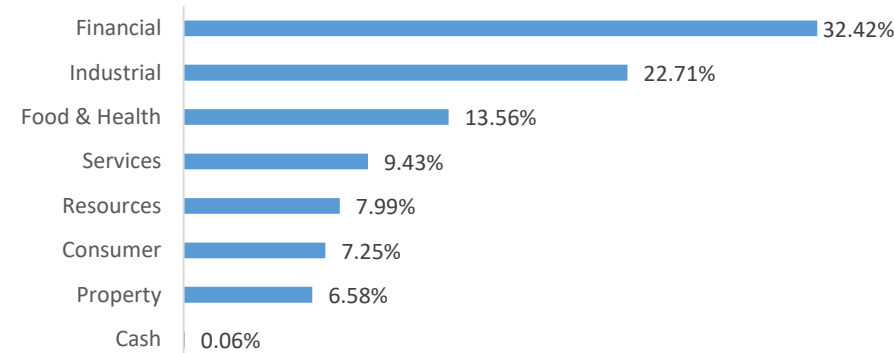
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Total Return**
